The Bible and Catholics

All Scripture is inspired by God

The eleven disciples went to the hill in Galilee where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshipped him, even though some of them doubted. Jesus drew near and said to them, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age."

Sometime after his death and resurrection Jesus appears to the disciples. He has a very special task for them. What does he ask them to do?

Jesus asks them to spread his word – to teach people to follow his commandments. Can you remember what these commandments are?

Jesus asks us to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves. Can you think of a time when you have shown love for a neighbour? Tell me a bit about it.

Jesus's words today weren't just for his disciples – they were for all of us. Saint Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary use words." What do you think this means?

So, what do you think is the best way of sharing Jesus's word with other people is? Is it telling them about Jesus? Or might it be better to show people through our actions?

What do you think we might do? We could be kind and generous and share with others – the same way we would like them to treat us. We could try to make sure that the world is a fairer place for all people to live in.

Can you think of anything else that we do to show we believe in Jesus?

At the end of the reading, Jesus says, "I am with you always, yes to the end of time." How does it make you feel to know that Jesus is always with us? How do you know that Jesus is still with us today?

What will you do this week to share Jesus's word with others through your actions?
